Bessie led the Foundation for 10 years and she is a brilliant leader. As a retired educator and principal, she's mastered the art of identifying talent, using all the talents of her team - none are too big or too small - to drive toward goals and build a warm and effective community. I have taken many notes and hope to serve the Delta San Francisco-Peninsula Foundation as ably as she has.

In my first address to you, I'm thrilled to report the Foundation's work reached new highs. Certainly that isn't a testament to me: it's the culmination of all the seeds planted and carefully tended by Bessie and the entire Board.

As our communities recover from the Covid-19 pandemic, we hosted three financial literacy seminars. We touched students through our seminar "Cruising Through College", which guided them through the financial aid process. We launched "Onyx Home Buying Series" in partnership with Onyx Realty, which delivered information and tactics to help working adults buy homes in the Bay Area. Finally, we continued with our signature Financial Fortitude programming. This year's focus was "Re-calibrating in the Time of COVID". If the past two years have taught us anything, it is that life brings storms and we want everyone to have the plans and resources in place to weather them.

Thank you to each of our partners who support our work. We have raised over \$100,000 this year! Your financial support and your volunteer hours have helped us keep shining a light to guide our community to achieve their financial dreams, be that buying a home, saving for college, retiring with dignity or helping loved ones. You've allowed us to support 7 scholars, a record number!, as they complete a 4-year college curriculum. Education is the first brick to healthy financial footing. Helping talented, hardworking young women, who've already demonstrated an early commitment to serving their communities is at the heart of why we do what we do.

Our mission is a consistent and persistent one: to improve the quality of life in the San Francisco Peninsula area by supporting programs that foster educational growth. LEGACY OF GIVING



HOME BUYING SEMINAR PATHWAYS TO HOMEOWNERSHIP

Sustainable homeownership is a major vehicle for building wealth and economic opportunity. Black homeownership rates are 43% compared to the overall homeownership rate of 65%.

In partnership with our community partner Nneka Jenkins (Onyx Wealth Realty), board president Farralon Udom and board member and mayor of East Palo Alto Regina Wallace Jones created the program's content and facilitated/moderated all sessions.

Across eight workshop sessions, participants learned how mortgage qualification works,

what to expect from a realtor and heard stories from everyday people who bought property in the Bay Area. Success came in a number of forms: buying multi-family properties in the Bay Area using FHA loans, using an FHA loan to acquire a property in a cheaper market that they then sold and used the proceeds to buy a home in the Bay Area, and buying a property to live in and renting out the other bedrooms to improve the cash flow and make the mortgage payments easier. They also heard from an Enrolled Agent who discussed the importance of documented income and the tax deductions afforded to homeowners.



FINANCIAL HEALTH RECALIBBRATING IN THE TIME OF COVID

The Foundation's financial literacy workshop is a cornerstone of how we serve and impact the lives of our community. Our goal is to move beyond community education into facilitating behavioral change in our community participants.

As Brandon Copland says, "Take ownership of your financial education so that you can change not only your life but your family's life for the better." Financial Health: Re-calibrating in the Time of COVID, our theme for 2021, focused on helping people recover from the financial shock caused by COVID, regaining control of their finances, and creating an action to increase their wealth. Our programming was designed to cover a broad range of financial topics enabling each participant to start where they felt comfortable.

This was our second year hosting the event virtually via Zoom. The virtual model enabled us to expand our reach to 94 participants. Fifty-one percent of these participants were first-time attendees.





